She has performed on various stages throughout Houston including The Alley Theatre in Aaron Sorkin's "The Farnsworth Invention", the Hobby Center, Main Street Theater, and Stages. She has worked with Tony and Obie-winning directors. She received a B.A. in Drama from the University of Texas in Austin and has continued her studies with various instructors including: The Margie Haber Studio in L.A., Jeff Perry of "Scandal" (also a founding member of the famed Steppenwolf Theater in Chicago), Kim Rubenstein (formerly of the Long Warf Theatre) and Dave Razowsky, Rick Kuhlman, & Sheldon Patinkin (Second City, L.A. & Chicago).
